




Eli's family disobeys God and are punished for it. Samuel becomes judge of Israel.



Israel asks for a King against God's better judgement for them. Saul is crowned King



### Mistakes

- Israel looked at other nations who had a king and assumed they were better off.
  - 1- They already had a King! God was their King!
  - 2- God gave them judges because of the problems of having a king.
  - · 3- God knows what is best for us.
- Saul was chosen to be king partially because of outward appearance. He was tall
  and good looking. Not a good reason to be king.
- After Saul's disobedience, God rejects Saul and choses another person who will take his place.








### Samuel Fears Saul



1 Samuel: 16 The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way; I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king."

2 But Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears about it, he will kill me."

# David Comforts Saul

<sup>14</sup> Now the Spirit of the LORD had departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the LORD tormented him.

<sup>17</sup> So Saul said to his attendants, "Find someone who plays well and bring him to me."

<sup>18</sup> One of the servants answered, "I have seen a son of Jesse of Bethlehem who knows how to play the lyre. He is a brave man and a warrior. He speaks well and is a fine-looking man. And the LORD is with him."

<sup>19</sup> Then Saul sent messengers to Jesse and said, "Send me your son David, who is with the sheep."



God had plans for David. Even though Samuel was scared to tell Saul of God's anointing of David, God brought David into Saul's court to comfort him.

### Questions

- David was chosen not because of looks or strength. What lesson do you think God was trying to teach the Israelites about their reasons for wanting a king?

  - 2- We should always ask for God's wisdom when making tough decisions.
